LACLEDE COUNTY R-1 SCHOOLS UNPAID MEAL POLICY

The MAXIMUM allowable charge is \$33.00 for meals.

When the balance reaches -\$15.00 you will receive an automated phone call.

Letters will be sent home with students to notify parents of negative balances.

When your students balance reaches -\$33.00, your student will be offered an alternative meal. Peanut Butter Sandwich, Vegetable, Fruit, and Milk, until negative balance is paid.

Jr. High/ High School students on Free/Reduced meals are allowed 1 breakfast and 1 lunch. If a student wants a second meal or second milk, must pay full price and a positive balance on account or pay cash daily.
